- Vitamin K 10 mg slow IV infusion (only if life threatening bleeding and INR > 5 because of anaphylaxis risk of IV route)
- Vitamin K 1mg po of IV solution (for INR 5-9 in setting of trauma)
- Cefazolin (Ancef) 1 g IV times one dose
- Td 0.5 ml IM if last Td booster > 10 years or unknown
