Case of the Lethargic Infant

- Description of case, based on a real patient
 - 3 month old, previously well, female with 24 hours of decreased feeding
 - Infant becomes lethargic
- Engage audience to determine investigations and differential
 - Provide real-time feedback on management and investigation by audience members
 - Review point-of-care ultrasonography imaging showing intussusception
 - Review standard-of-care treatment for infants with ileocolic intussusception

Case of the Persistent Sore Throat

- Description of case, based on a real patient
 - 17 year old, previously well, male with 6 days of pharyngitis despite adequate antibiotic treatment
- Engage audience to determine investigations and differential
 - Provide real-time feedback on management and investigation by audience members
 - Review pathology of Lemierre's Disease
 - Review standard-of-care treatment for patient with Lemierre's Disease
